



Requirements for applications to the “Stapledon Memorial Trust Award for European Early Stage Researchers” for the EGF-EUCARPIA 2019 Joint Symposium in Zurich

The Stapledon Memorial Trust have awarded EGF-EUCARPIA 2019 funding to support nine young European Early Stage Researchers to attend the joint symposium in Zürich in June 2019. Successful applicants will get 400.- CHF of their conference fee reimbursed. To qualify for the grant you must:

- Be younger than 35 on the 1st June 2019 (copy of passport required) or have completed your PhD later than January 2013 (please provide date of graduation)
- Be undertaking or have completed a Masters or PhD [provide university/College name and supervisor(s) name(s)]
- Be a resident of an [EGF member country](#)
- Have submitted a paper for the symposium as a first author and have it accepted for an oral or poster presentation
- Personally present the paper (oral or poster) at the conference
- Submit a short curriculum vitae (one page) and a list of your publications to date
- Submit a short (400 word max) letter of application outlining why you are requesting the grant and how attending the EGF-EUCARPIA joint symposium will benefit your scientific career. Please include the title of your contribution and the list of authors in the letter.
- Submit a two page report on your attendance at EGF-EUCARPIA joint symposium 2019 by 31 July 2019.

If you wish to apply for the grant please email your letter of application, proof of age (copy of passport) or graduation, CV and list of publications. Please, submit your application to secretariat@egfeucarpia2019.ch not later than Thursday 28 March 2019. Winners of the award will be informed before the early bird registration closes.

The Stapledon Memorial Trust Award is highly competitive and selection criteria for being awarded are the quality of the contribution to the conference (paper) and of the application.
